## What is “By the People Lobby Day”?

The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) of Georgia is offering lobby training to our coalition partners each Tuesday during the legislative session. On Tuesday, January 31<sup>st</sup>, special focus will be on legislation that will impact immigrant and refugee communities in our state.

- How best to help push or stop legislation
- Legislative updates given by coalition partners such as Georgia Rural Urban Summit (GRUS)
- A walking tour of the Capitol’s lobbying area and introduction to the legislative process
- Assistance in meeting your senator and representative
