
Security Enhancements for VP Visit

As Savannah welcomes Vice President Mike Pence for the 2018 St. Patrick's Day Parade, there will be enhanced security in the downtown area. Learn more about how this will effect your parade experience on this page.

Enhanced Security Zone

There will be an enhanced security zone established between Bay St. and Oglethorpe Ave, and Drayton St. and Whitaker St. Within the enhanced security zone, parade-goers will be required to pass through magnetometer check points and follow specific rules.

Enhanced Security Zone



The enhanced security zone will be activated at 12:01 a.m. on Saturday morning.

Schedule for Enhanced Security Zone on Saturday, March 17

12:01 a.m.: No cars can be parked on any street within the enhanced security zone beginning at this time, including the vehicles of residents. **CARS WILL BE TOWED AT THIS TIME.** Vehicles will still be permitted to drive through the secure zone until 2 a.m.

4 a.m - 7 a.m.: No one is allowed into the enhanced security zone during this time due to a security sweep of the area. During this time, only residents of the area who already in the secure zone will be permitted. Residents are subject to be stopped at this time and will be asked for identification and proof of residency (utility bill, bank statement). Business owners and employees will not be permitted in the secure zone until the magnetometer check points open at 7 a.m.

7 a.m. - **10 a.m.**: The secure zone will re-open for pedestrians. All pedestrians wanting to enter the secure zone must pass through a magnetometer check point. If you want to watch the parade from within the secure zone, you must clear the check points and be in your spot starting at 7 a.m. and no later than 10 a.m. After 10 a.m. the enhanced security zone will be closed and pedestrians wishing to enter will be denied at the check points.

Please note: Inside the enhanced security zone, pedestrians will not be allowed to cross the parade route (Bull Street) at any time until security clearance is given at approximately 1 p.m.

Security Check Points

There will be magnetometer check points that parade-goers must enter through to access the enhanced security zone. At the checkpoint, you will be subject to search and you won't be able to bring in any prohibited items (see Do's and Don'ts list below).

The checkpoints will be at the following locations and are marked on the map above:

- · Whitaker at Bay Lane
- Whitaker at Saint Julian Street
- · Whitaker at Congress Street
- Whitaker at Broughton Street

- Drayton at Bay Lane
- Drayton at Broughton Street
- Drayton at President Street

Pedestrians coming from the west side of Savannah are encouraged to use the Saint Julian Street and Broughton Street check points on the intersection of Whitaker Street. Pedestrians coming from the east side of Savannah are encouraged to use the President Street and Broughton Street check points on the intersection of Drayton Street.

Do's and Don'ts

Within the Enhanced Security Zone, parade-goers will be required to follow specific rules and many items will be strictly prohibited. Items listed in the "NO" column **cannot** be brought into the enhanced security zone. Items in the "YES" column will be allowed.

All items are subject to search by the security screener.

Due to the number of restrictions in the enhanced security zone, the City is providing bleacher seating for paradegoers in this area.

All parade-goers will be able to purchase items from stores that are open inside the secure zone. In addition, four food trucks will be operating within the secure zone; two will be in Johnson square and two will be in Wright Square.
