Re: Georgia Secretary of State App Contains Links to Your Campaign Pages

To the Office of the Secretary of State:

In March 2018, the ACLU of Georgia sent you a letter expressing concern that your government website linked directly to social media pages that you were using for both campaign and official purposes. (See attached Exhibit 1.) This carried serious First Amendment implications because we received reports about comments being deleted from your social media pages. Although elected officials are permitted to curate their personal/campaign pages as they see fit, the First Amendment prohibits them from deleting comments on official government social media sites open to the public. We notice that you have since removed the links to your campaign social media sites from your government website.¹

Recently, however, it was brought to our attention that the Georgia Secretary of State app, which is the official government app used to obtain voting information, contains prominent links at the bottom of the screen directly linking to your campaign social media sites on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram.² Screenshots are attached to the end of this letter.

Government resources should be used to help facilitate the right to vote, not to promote your campaign. To protect yourself against constitutional liability, we urge you to remove the links to your campaign social media sites from the official government app as soon as possible.




Screenshot from the Georgia Secretary of State app home screen:



Re: Censorship on the Secretary of State Office's Government Facebook Page

To the Office of the Secretary of State:

Our democracy thrives when people can freely criticize elected officials—including the Secretary of State. This letter concerns your office's apparent attempt to silence one of your constituents, who posted a critical comment on your Facebook page, found at: www.facebook.com/BrianKempGA. That comment was later deleted, even though your page is otherwise open for public comment.

Although your Facebook page ostensibly appears to be a personal gubernatorial campaign page, ii your government website directly links to your campaign Facebook page as well as your campaign Twitter page. iii In addition, you routinely use your personal campaign Facebook page to conduct official government business, as dozens of posts from the last year demonstrate. There also does not appear to be any other Facebook page affiliated with your office. Your Facebook page is thus the Office of the Secretary of State's official government page subject to the requirements of the First Amendment.

Under the First Amendment, if the Secretary of State Office's government Facebook page has been opened for any member of the public to post comments, it is considered a "limited public forum." See Perry Educ. Ass'n v. Perry Local Educators' Ass'n, 460 U.S. 37 (1983). And when a limited public forum has been created, it is unconstitutional for the government to discriminate against certain speakers because of the viewpoints they express. See Rosenberger v. Rector & Visitors of Univ. of Virginia, 515 U.S. 819, 829 (1995). Though legal challenges to censorship on government social media sites are a relatively new phenomenon, at least one court has already found that targeted censorship on government Facebook pages open for public comment is unconstitutional. See Davison v. Loudon County, 2016 WL 4801617 (E.D. Va. Sept. 14, 2016) and 2017 WL 58294 (E.D. Va. Jan. 4, 2017).

As social media becomes more integral to the political process and public discourse, government officials must not engage in any form of viewpoint censorship in violation of the First Amendment. As the Supreme Court of the United States has recently said, "[i]t is cyberspace—the 'vast democratic forums of the Internet' in general, and social media in

particular," that is "the most important place[] . . . for the exchange of views" in the modern era. Packingham v. North Carolina, 137 S. Ct. 1730, 1735 (2017).

To protect yourself against constitutional liability, we trust that you will undertake a review of your social media policies to ensure that your office does not engage in viewpoint discrimination on your government Facebook page.






